Business Email Compromise (BEC) is a cyberattack where attackers impersonate trusted individuals or organisations through emails to deceive victims into taking actions, such as transferring funds or sharing sensitive information.

RECOGNISING A BEC ATTACK

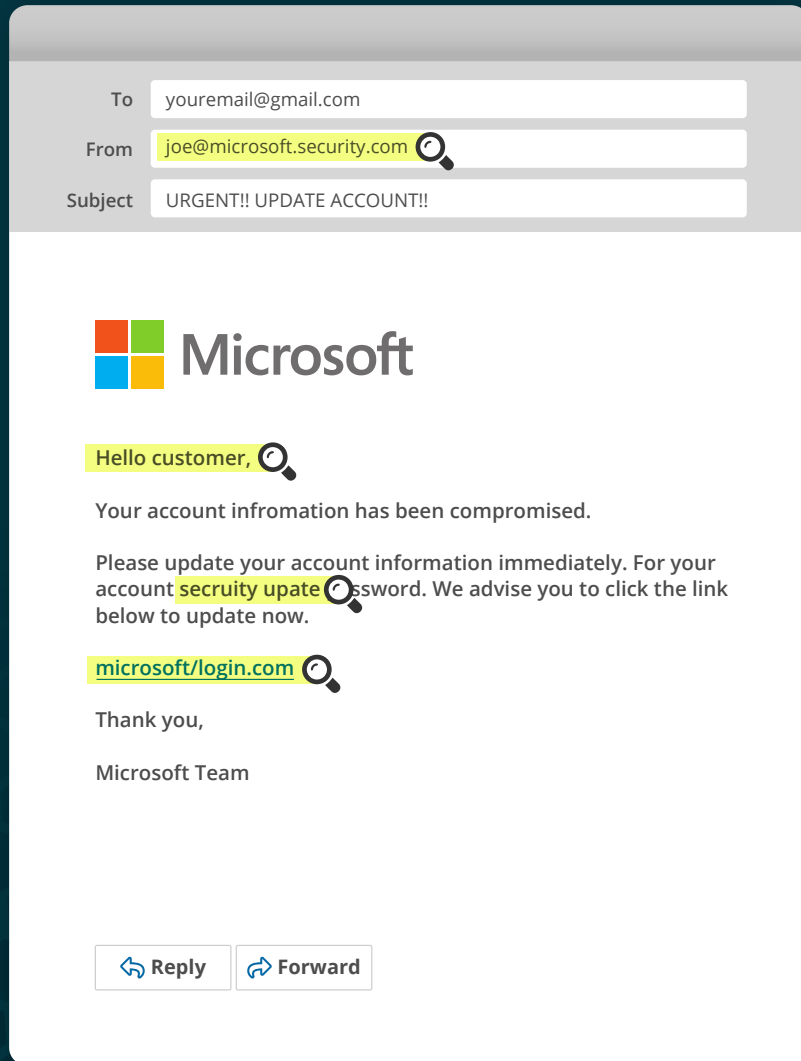
✘ Poor spelling, grammar and punctuation
BEC attempts often contain errors in language usage.

✘ Unusual formatting, appearance or domain
Be cautious of messages that look different from the sender's typical style or come from random

✘ Non-official email address
Messages not originating from official email addresses or domains may indicate a BEC attack.

✘ Improper greeting or signature
Unusual greetings, signatures or contact information could suggest phishing attempts and BEC attacks.

✘ Unusual fund requests
Payment requests to uncommon addresses through unusual methods should be treated cautiously.



✘ Email-only communication
If the sender avoids other channels of communication, it's suspicious.

✘ Urgency & rushed transactions
BEC attackers create a sense of urgency to manipulate victims into
